New Brunswick Theological Seminary

We are a multiethnic, intergenerational, ecumenical theological institution of higher education that instills creative, contextual, and critical thinking and a passion for justice that reflects God's transforming love in Jesus Christ.

Our History

New Brunswick Seminary began in 1784, when the Synod of the Reformed Protestant Dutch Church—now known as the Reformed Church in America—elected a New York pastor named John Henry Livingston (1746– 1825) to be its "professor." His task was to prepare students to become the Reformed Church's ministers of the Word.

Livingston fulfilled that task first in New York City and then, from 1810 until his death, in New Brunswick, where—at first sharing a building and other resources with Queen's College (now Rutgers University)—what began as only a small group consisting of this theological professor and his students, quickly acquired the structures of organization and support that made it a resilient institution. And here in New Brunswick, surrounded by the College Avenue campus of Rutgers (though from 1867 no longer officially connected with it), the seminary has thrived for more than two centuries.

Over that time, some things have not changed. The seminary's task is still to prepare ministers for their calling. It still has ties to the Reformed Church in America, and it remains centered in the doctrines of the grace and sovereignty of God that are dear to the Reformed tradition.

But in many other respects, the seminary has changed, especially over the last half-century, as the range of communities it serves has broadened and its vision of ministry has widened. Beginning in the 1960s, major adjustments in the curriculum brought a new emphasis on urban ministry. Then in the 1970s, NBTS made a commitment to offer evening classes and to welcome part-time students, female students, and students of color. Thus began an evolution which has continued ever since—seen more recently in our move to online and hybrid learning which expands our reach and serves our students in ways that meet their needs. All these developments reflect a vision which we still embrace today: to be a multiethnic, intergenerational, ecumenical theological institution of higher education that instills creative, contextual, and critical thinking and a passion for justice that reflects God's transforming love in Jesus Christ.

Purpose

Called in Jesus Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit, New Brunswick Theological Seminary participates in God's own laboring to fulfill God's reign on earth.

Rooted in the Reformed tradition and centered in its trust of God's sovereignty and grace, the Seminary is an inter-cultural, ecumenical school of Christian faith, learning, and scholarship committed to its metro-urban and global contexts.

Our purpose is to educate persons and strengthen communities for transformational, public ministries in church and society. We fulfill this mission through creative, contextual, and critical engagement with texts, traditions, and practices.

Vision

We envision empowered leaders, ministries, and communities who actively pursue, promote, and engage in the work of justice, reconciliation, and unity, affirming the equality of all God's people.

We envision a community of graduates who bear witness to God's light in the world, where all lives are dignified and all voices are heard, and all are included to share in God's bountiful love.

We envision spiritual communities who embody grace and love, rooted in critical, creative, contextual thinking and leadership that inspires others to live fruitful and faithful lives.

We envision a world where hearts are renewed, justice is established, and faith is restored.

Mission

Reverend Dr. J. Michael Sanders

Fountain Baptist Church



J. Michael Sanders is a native of Charlotte, North Carolina. At present he is Pastor of Fountain Baptist Church in Summit, New Jersey. He has held this position since December of 1983. Prior to this, Rev. Sanders served as Pastor of the Mt. Nebo Baptist Church in Lake Lure, North Carolina.

Pastor Sanders is a graduate of Benedict College in Columbia, South Carolina, where he received the Bachelor of Arts Degree. He received the Master of Divinity Degree from Duke University School of Divinity in Durham, North Carolina. Pastor Sanders was awarded The Honorary Degree of Doctor of Divinity from Benedict College, The Honorary Degree of Doctor of Humane Letters from Florida Memorial University and The Honorary Degree of Doctor of Divinity from New Brunswick Theological Seminary.

Pastor Sanders is a Life Member of the NAACP and a Life Member of Alpha Phi Omega National Service Fraternity. He is also a member of American Baptist Churches, the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc., Summit Interfaith Clergy Association and the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Convention. Pastor Sanders has led Fountain to be a strong supporter of mission. Over seven hundred thousand dollars has been given to the United Negro College Fund. Fountain gave a grant of thirty thousand dollars to aid churches in Haiti.

Fountain purchased a three hundred-thousand-dollar office building in Johannesburg, South Africa. The building was donated to the Baptist Convention of South Africa to serve as National Headquarters for the Convention. Fountain in 2006, made a two-year commitment for a one-million-dollar donation to help with relief efforts in the Gulf Coast; this donation was realized in 2007.

Pastor Sanders is a former member of the Board of Trustees for the New Brunswick Theological Seminary where he led Fountain Baptist Church to make a \$300,000 donation to the Seminary which is one of the largest ever given by an African American church. He is former Moderator for the Middlesex Central Baptist Association, and former President of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Convention. Pastor Sanders now serves as President of the General Baptist Convention of New Jersey.

Presidential Service Award

The Women of the Reformed Church in America

Celebrating half a century of ordained women's ministry in the RCA



Women have actively served the RCA throughout its nearly 400-year history. However, it wasn't until 1972 that the denomination opened the offices of deacon and elder to women, with women accepted for ordination as ministers of Word and sacrament in 1979. With all ecclesiastical roles open to them, more RCA women started attending seminaries such as NBTS, equipping themselves for church leadership.

It has been an honor for NBTS to provide theological education to women in the RCA, along with women of many other denominations. Currently, RCA women are enrolled in certificate, master's, and doctoral programs at NBTS. According to Rev. Elizabeth Testa, the RCA's Coordinator for Women's Transformation and Leadership and Equity–Based Hospitality, NBTS is unequivocally committed to equipping women for church leadership: "NBTS supports women students and incarnates

gender justice through its hiring practices and curriculum. The Seminary offers interpersonal and structural support to all its diverse students."

Today, women in the RCA serve as pastors, elders, and deacons, as well as in other leadership roles. They contribute their gifts, influence, and resources through denominational commissions and councils; in classis, regional synod, and general synod leadership and staff positions; as faculty and administration of seminaries and colleges; and in countless local ministries. Women have served as General Synod presidents and as moderators for the General Synod Council.

NBTS celebrates *all* the women of the RCA, those serving in ordained offices and in all other roles in the Church. Together we work toward the full inclusion of women's gifts and leadership in the body of Christ.

Our Chapel Preacher Reverend Dr. Danielle L. Brown Senior Pastor, Shiloh Baptist Church

NBTS MA & MDiv 2010

Saved and filled with the Holy Ghost at an early age, The Reverend Dr. Danielle L. Brown finds great joy and satisfaction in learning, living, and preaching the Gospel. Rev. Dr. Brown was Licensed to preach on July 17, 2003, by Cathedral International (The Historic Second Baptist Church) in Perth Amboy, New Jersey, and ordained by the American Baptist Churches on June 3, 2012. An increasingly sought–after preacher and workshop leader with the ability to communicate across multiple generations, Dr. Brown has had the opportunity to share the Gospel throughout this country and in South Africa.

Educated in the Perth Amboy Public Schools, Rev. Dr. Brown went on to attend Virginia State University where she was a Provost Scholar and three-sport athlete. After teaching in the Richmond Public Schools, Rev. Brown responded to God's call to return to her hometown and the church of her rearing where she served faithfully on the Pastoral Staff for 15 years.


On August 7, 2021, Dr. Brown was elected the tenth Senior Pastor of the Shiloh Baptist Church in Plainfield, New Jersey. She is the first woman to hold this position since the church's founding in 1908.

A natural leader, Rev. Dr. Brown has served in various capacities where she has worked to develop and implement ministry programs and strategies. She has a passion for mentoring and assisting in the development of faith and community leaders. As such, she is a site supervisor in the Princeton Theological Seminary, New Brunswick Theological Seminary, and Pillar College Field Education Programs, has taught on the adjunct faculty of New York Theological Seminary, and served two terms on the Board of Trustees of New Brunswick Theological Seminary. She has also been active in the Raritan Association of the American Baptist Churches of New Jersey as past Moderator and on the Ordination Committee. Dr. Brown is currently a co-mentor to the Pointer/Brown/Goodman Doctoral Fellows at United Theological Seminary in Dayton, OH. She has the honor of serving on the Advisory Board of the Women in Ministry Conference, Inc. convened by The Rev. Dr. Cynthia L. Hale in Atlanta, GA, and as the Assistant Secretary of the Hampton University Minister's Conference. Dr. Brown is a proud member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated. In addition to her ecclesiastical work, she is active in her local community as a member of the Perth Amboy Area NAACP, serving on the Mayor's Strategic Planning Team and 100 Days Committee in the City of Perth Amboy. She is also a member of the Perth Amboy Board of Education. Through the years, Dr. Brown has been the recipient of multiple awards and recognitions for her work in the church and community.

Both servant and scholar, Rev. Dr. Brown holds Master of Education and Bachelor of Science Degrees from Virginia State University in Petersburg, Virginia, and both a Master of Divinity Degree and Master of Arts Degree from New Brunswick Theological Seminary in New Brunswick, New Jersey. She also holds an earned Doctor of Ministry Degree from Palmer Theological Seminary in St. David's Pennsylvania, where she studied Leadership and Church Renewal.

The Gardner A. Sage Library "The Jewel of the Campus"



The Sage Library is named after Gardner Avery Sage, a layperson from New York City who donated heavily and personally oversaw its construction. His vision was for an extensive collection in theology that was a model for other libraries to follow, accessible not just to seminarians, but the broader community as well. It's history and mission are detailed in New Brunswick Theological Seminary; An Illustrated History, 1784–2014 by Dr. John W. Coakley, L. Russell Feakes Memorial Professor of Church History Emeritus; the use of the library was, "to be extended to the whole Church and to the citizens of New Brunswick." In 2023, the Sage Library community continues to include not only NBTS students, faculty, and alumni, but also Rutgers students, faculty, alumni, area clergy, and enthusiasts for the Reformed Church in America. By the grace of God and generous support from NBTS benefactors, Sage Library flourishes as the physical and digital hub for theological research in the New Brunswick area.

Sage Library was designed by German architect Detliff Lienau to hold 40,000 books. It was designed to look like a 4th century Roman church. In 1875 only the Great Hall and its second story were complete, with a basement. The intention was always to complete an expansion when funding was available for the Library to form the shape of a cross, the Great Hall being the "nave." The cross formation follows early Medieval and Gothic church styles typical of academic libraries in the 1840–1880 era. Sage Library's book hall style is thought to be one of only four left in the USA. The Gardner A. Sage Library now contains more than 160,000 bound volumes and 300 periodicals. Its archives and historical collections include rare manuscripts and artifacts. The Gardner A. Sage Library of the future will maintain the library building's historic integrity and spiritual atmosphere that inspires scholarship, while enhancing its physical accessibility, and the collection's discoverability, to better foster research.

NBTS Student Profile "Two Positions, One Mission"

Rev. Laura Osborne

NBTS DMin in Missiology and Global Christianity, expected 2024 Campus Pastor, International Campus Ministry, Western Michigan University RCA Coordinator for Interreligious Relations

For some, juggling two half-time jobs would be a struggle. In Pastor Laura Osborne's case, the positions match so well that any struggle is outpaced by the rewards.

Laura's eight years as campus pastor among international students at Western Michigan University (WMU) reflect her own transformative experience in campus ministry as an undergrad. Though she had grown up in a Christian home, the mentoring she received through campus ministry grew her faith and sparked her own interest in becoming a pastor.

At WMU, Laura works with another pastor to create a community of welcome and hospitality for international students of any faith. Her ministry consists of oneon-one discipleship, Bible studies, and community lunches every Thursday. Lunch volunteers include people of all ages and religions, from Buddhist students to seniors from community churches. Though no preaching occurs at these meals, meaningful conversations happen around faith.

Four years ago, Laura donned another hat when she became the RCA Coordinator for Interreligious Relations. This position dovetails with her campus ministry work because both involve interfaith encounters and relationships.

Core to her RCA work are networks and partnerships, such as with-

- the CRC in facilitating Journeys into Friendship, a movement of Christlike friendship with neighbors of different cultures and religions.
- Shoulder to Shoulder, an organization equipping American faith leaders to address anti-Muslim discrimination and violence.

Laura emphasizes the importance of interfaith understanding, especially at a time when antisemitism and other hate crimes are on the rise in the United States.

NBTS' DMin in Missiology and Global Christianity is a perfect fit for Laura's interests and ministry. She loves adding to her knowledge about the history and practices of Christianity across the globe. Laura, as much as anyone, senses the global/local connections as people from all over the world cross her path every day.

NBTS Alum Profile "I like to be challenged"

Rev. Dr. Mashona Walston

NBTS MDiv 2003, DMin in Pastoral Care and Counseling 2018 Senior Pastor, First Church of Albany, NY

Mashona Walston was toughing it out at army basic training when she met a chaplain. In this first exposure to chaplaincy, she observed him carefully—the way he listened and ministered to her and her colleagues. The clear revelation of "That's me!" challenged Mashona to consider seminary.

Enrolling in NBTS was a practical choice: it was affordable and not far from her people in Brooklyn, NY. But it proved to be the right choice. In the early 2000s, NBTS was ahead of its time in its training for urban ministry. Mashona was challenged to understand the importance of land, viewing land and property through the spectrum of colonialism and its effect on urban communities.



Mashona has served in the American Methodist

Episcopal Church, the Reformed Church in America, and at the New York State Veterans Home. While a chaplain among veterans, she realized that she had more to understand, more to learn. An NBTS friend recommended the Seminary's new DMin in Pastoral Care and Counseling, and she couldn't shake the possibility.

Like in her MDiv program, Mashona again appreciated the challenging dialogue that occurred between seminarians of different ages, cultures, and denominations. Her professors also challenged her thinking. In the course Addictions and Spirituality, Dr. Ronald Hayes pushed Mashona and her classmates to examine the role of evil in the world. For example, is there a spiritual aspect to drug and alcohol addiction? And if we don't acknowledge that dimension, can we be truly effective in pastoral counseling?

Mashona's doctoral research considered how we can use the brain's capacity for neuroplasticity (the brain's capacity to change how it responds to stimuli) to promote wellness in ourselves and others. Her focus was on how centering prayer, with its use of silence and a sacred word, can alter our habitual thinking patterns. She has seen the powerful effect of centering prayer on veterans and church attendees.

Mashona is all about partnerships, and under Mashona's leadership, First Church is finding new ways to team with the community. A nearby Spanish-speaking Montessori school did not have a place for its children to play; now First Church's gym echoes with their laughter and energy. The church's green space is used to serve neighborhood meals, such as soup and sandwiches in the winter. "It's easy to lock ourselves indoors and fear our neighbors", says Mashona. "But if we contribute to our neighbor's wellness, fear diminishes and care increases."

What is an endowed faculty chair?

An endowed faculty chair is a permanent faculty position funded by designated gifts to NBTS. The earnings from the endowment cover the designated professor's salary and benefits, regularly contributing to the Seminary's annual budget. Besides receiving the honor bestowed from holding an endowed chair, the awarded faculty member is encouraged in their academic endeavors, from research to publishing to conference presentations.
